### **FREE SCHOOL MEALS:**

#### A HELPFUL PROGRAM OR A RISKY AMBITION? LET'S TALK ABOUT MBG

Recently, the Indonesian government under President Prabowo and Vice President Gibran launched a new program called MBG (Makan Bergizi Gratis)—a free meal initiative for students in selected schools across the country.

While the idea of providing nutritious meals for students is commendable, its implementation has sparked a nationwide debate. Several cases of food poisoning affecting students and teachers have been reported since the program began, leading to concern and frustration among parents. Some incidents even required hospitalization, highlighting gaps in food safety and supervision.

Another area of concern is the financial cost. To fund this ambitious initiative, the government has reportedly increased certain taxes and shifted funds from other sectors. Understandably, this raises questions about budget priorities.

So, is MBG really necessary? Or is it a well-intentioned idea that needs better planning?

#### Learning from Other Countries

Countries like China have successfully run similar programs for years. However, their success lies in strong systems, strict quality control, and clear targeting—often focusing on children in remote or underprivileged areas who truly need help with food access.

In contrast, many Indonesian parents feel that the program is being rolled out too quickly, with insufficient preparation and monitoring. Some believe it would be safer and healthier if children brought meals from home, especially in urban areas where access to food isn't a pressing issue.

#### **Concerns About Execution**

Food Safety: The current system lacks strict checks, which has led to unfortunate health incidents.

**Corruption Risks:** With large budgets at stake, transparency and accountability become even more crucial.

**Generalization:** Instead of focusing on students in real need, the one-size-fits-all approach may not be effective nationwide.

#### **Call for Better Solutions**

This doesn't mean the MBG program should be dismissed. Rather, it needs a more thoughtful approach:

- Target areas where students struggle to access nutritious food
- Involve local schools and parents in menu planning and supervision
- Strengthen quality control and hygiene standards
- Ensure transparency in budgeting and vendor selection

#### Final Thought for Parents and Students

Free meals at school can be a great support—but only if they are safe, nutritious, and well—managed. We hope that the government listens to public feedback and strengthens the program so it can truly benefit students across Indonesia.

#### What We Learned

- O means nothing inside (an empty container)
- 1 means there is one item inside (a container with 1 ball)

#### Activity Highlight: Ball & Box Math!

he children had so much fun with this simple hands-on activity:

- We showed an empty box and said:
   "This is zero. There is nothing inside."
- Then we placed one ball in another box and said: "This is one. There is one ball inside."
- Each child took turns showing which box was 0 and which was 1!

- Understanding the concept of zero (0) and one (1)
- Identifying empty and full
- Counting aloud
- Taking turns and listening

Character Week was fun and inspiring. It taught us valuable lessons that we will carry throughout the year.














#### **First Five Days at School**


