
















FISH COLLAGE

Encourage creativity and self-expression.










Musical scales






















Meaning of Musical scales

Musical scale is a set of notes (sounds) arranged in ascending or descending order, based on their frequency or pitch, and with a specific interval pattern. A scale serves as a "palette" or foundation in musical composition, providing a range of notes that can be used to create melodies and harmonies.




What is Photosynthesis?

Photosynthesis is how plants make their own food using sunlight, water, and carbon dioxide to create sugar (food) and oxygen, which they need to grow and which we need to breathe. The process happens in the leaves, inside tiny parts called chloroplasts, where a green substance called chlorophyll traps sunlight to power the food-making reaction.





LEARNING THROUGH PLAY

As they play, children try things out, test what they know, practise new skills and get better at them. They learn who they are (identity), how to get along with others (community), how to look after themselves and others (wellbeing), how to think (learn), and communicate- these are sometimes described as children developing social, emotional, thinking and physical skills







What can be done to encourage children to play?

- 1.Look for opportunities to extend your child's play by offering ideas or encouraging them to use equipment or toys or books in new or unusual ways.
- 2. Creative play can happen through painting, sculpting, drawing, singing, solving problems and building things
- 3. Quiet play can involve picture books, puzzles, dolls, colouring, beads or listening to CDs with stories.










Vaccination Day


